Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, a number of children who are enrolled in our parish sacramental program will be making their first Holy Communion at parish Masses. We extend our heartfelt congratulations to them, and to their families, on what is a most sacred occasion. I would also like to add my own word of thanks to Teresa Martin for her tireless efforts as parish sacramental coordinator, and to the principal of St Elizabeth's School, Peter Griffin, and Bronwyn Stutz APRE, for their assistance in arranging a classroom for the children's preparation.



This weekend's feast of Corpus Christi, which we chose precisely because it is a most fitting day for making one's first Holy Communion, was instituted following the famous Eucharistic miracle in Orvieto (Italy) in c.1264. Every year, we celebrate this feast as a needed reminder not to take the real presence of Christ in the Sacrament of the Altar for granted. We know from Church history that when faith in and love for the Lord present body, blood, soul and divinity in the Sacrament are strong, the life of the Church is also strong, and that when faith in and love for the Sacrament decline, so does the life of the Church. Therein lies the simple yet profound answer to current difficulties in the life of the Church, both here and around the world. Let us pray for a deeper faith and more committed

love for the Lord Jesus truly present in the Most Holy Eucharist.

May I also warmly encourage you to participate in the Corpus Christi procession at St Stephen's Cathedral at 2pm on Sunday June 3? It is always a most wonderfully inspiring event with its own unmistakable atmosphere and character, and an important opportunity for a public demonstration of faith at a time when citizens' rights to various public expressions of faith are being eroded to a greater and greater extent.

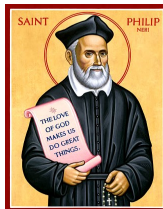

MASS READINGS

First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. 'This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-15

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

Gospel: Mark 14:12-16.22-26

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover. And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it', he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.' After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.
